"This competition fits into the Monroe concept of real-world education," said Frank Costantino, Dean of the School of Hospitality Management and the Culinary Arts and a certified American Culinary Federation competition judge. "We're providing a real world opportunity for motivated high school students to demonstrate their skills in a state-of-the art facility, get a taste of what's it's like to perform under pressure, and even have a chance to win a scholarship."

Among the prizes is a full academic scholarship to the Monroe College School of Hospitality Management and the Culinary Arts and admission to the 15-week study abroad program in Italy.
